内容融洽度：学生续写内容与原文主题（谣言的危害及化解）、人物性格（“我”的愧疚、Del的包容）高度契合，通过“我”坦白、Del原谅、共同参与游戏的情节，自然延续了原文中“我”从误解到愧疚的转变，无矛盾或无情节。

2. 篇章结构 中

篇章结构连贯性：第一段续写内容直接响应“*At recess the next day, I saw Del sitting alone watching the kickball game*”的段首句，通过“我”的坦白行为完成情节衔接；第二段续写内容以“*Now that Del had forgiven me*”为起点，展开“我”澄清谣言、Del融入游戏的情节，与段首句紧密呼应。两段之间，第一段的“*Del was too surprised to utter a word*”自然过渡到第二段“我”决定澄清的行动，整体情节发展连贯合理。

3. 语法词汇

词汇语法多样性: 学生运用了"a quiet sorrow clouded his face"、"gnawed my conscious"、"a ripple of surprised"等生动表达, 以及"nothing can outweigh the relief of making things right"等总结性语句, 提升了文章可读性, 但部分句式较为基础。通过比喻、拟人等手法丰富了场景描写。可尝试更多样的句式结构。

卷面分析

学生作答共计269字左右。卷面约有3处涂改痕迹，均为小区域涂改，如单词“is”“s”“c”被涂抹。卷面整体表现优秀，书写工整美观，排版规范有序，整体整洁度高，展现出良好的书写习惯。

小细节改进：“players”前需加定冠词“the”（特指踢球赛的球员），句子会更规范哦！
